Just bring it, put it on display table, and stay seated during the tell part. We can then enjoy looking at your project. Don't worry about if it is good enough, just bring it. We are all here to enjoy and improve our woodworking skills. I doubt I will ever even come close to mastering woodworking. It's just fun to do the best I can.
