Presidents Corner

Our Oct 11 meeting was an opportunity to learn about Dan Risse's epoxy river table. Dan's presentation and showing of a beautiful table, finished with lots of great questions from the audience. Dan's description of epoxy processes, learning experiences, failures, successes, led me to one conclusion. "If I want to use epoxy, I will just take the project to Dan."

On 13 Oct, we toured Kreg Tool, at their new location, in Ankeny. It was a great tour. I was surprised that the large facility was mostly used for warehousing. The experimental machine shop, discussion of plastic part development and the large wood shop were all very interesting. Many Kreg tools/machines were available for handling, comparison and operation. Now we need to arrange a tour of the Kreg manufacturing location in Huxley, Iowa. The tour ended with an opportunity to buy, returned/excess tools, at a 75% discount. CVWA members were joined by about 12 Cedar Rapids woodworkers. Thanks to Dave Turner for making this happen for both groups.

During the past week, Dan Stephens and I have been fixing his failing garage ceiling/attic floor structure. We considered alternate options, and have now competed a fix. In January, Dan will present how we stabilized the ceiling and then reinforced the assembly. The process started in temperatures that hovered near freezing. Luckily, we had warm days for adhesive curing during the final assembly. It was fun to work together during this project. The results look great. The good news is: "all items in the attic, are still in the attic". Ask Dan about the number of clamps needed to make this fix happen.

Rod Lair will lead our 8 November CVWA member meeting. I have volunteered as a poll worker on our meeting day. Be sure and get out to vote.
